capital city	The main city in a country			
London	The capital city of England			
city	A large town, usually with a cathedral. Lots of people live and work in cities.			
town	A built-up area that is larger than a village but smaller than a city.			
village	A group of houses and other buildings in a small rural area.			
coastal	Near the coast (the sea)			
rural	An area in the countryside			
urban	An area in the city or town			
landmark	A feature of a place that is easily recognised.
