Jurassic era	The Jurassic Period was the second of three geologic time periods of the Mesozoic Era. The Jurassic began about 201 million years ago at the end of the Triassic Period and ended 145 million years ago at the start of the Cretaceous Period.
Fossils	Fossils are the remains or traces of plants and animals that lived long ago.
